AGENDA: Mayor Haynes called for a motion to adopt the agenda as presented.

1. **VERNON HAVEN INC./DO DAH'S SPORTS BAR & GRILL - 1422 GREEN ROAD**

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Finance Chairman Graves reported that finances are on track for the year. Taxes are 93% collected at this time.

INFRASTRUCTURE: There is one new development with the water commission. This will be reported on at a later date.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL & TECHNOLOGY: Presentation of the second reading of an amendment to the alcoholic beverage ordinance. The amendment reads as follows:

ORDINANCE

To Amend Article I Sec. 15-1 and Article II License Sec. 15-64, Sec. 15-96 of the CODE OF ORDINANCES OF the CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA, captioned "Alcoholic Beverages" by repealing existing Article I Sec. 15-1 and Article II Sec. 15-64, Sec. 15-96 in its entirety and replacing therewith a re-stated Article I Sec. 15-1, still to be entitled "Alcoholic Beverages" and Article II License Sec. 15-64 and Sec. 15-96, which shall constitute a comprehensive Alcoholic Beverage Ordinance for the City of Chatsworth; and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, and by the Authority of the same, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED as follows:

1. Repeal existing Article I Sec. 15-1 and Article II Sec. 15-64, Sec. 15-96 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, in its entirety replacing therewith a re-stated Article I Sec. 15-1 and Article II Sec. 15-64 and Sec. 15-96 still to be entitled "Alcoholic Beverages"

ARTICLE I. GENERAL

Sec. 15-1 Definitions.

Restaurant means any public place kept, used, maintained, advertised and held out to the public as a place where meals are regularly served, such place being provided with a kitchen and a separate dining room, equipment, and personnel to serve, and regular seating for 60 persons. The serving of food shall consist of at least one meal per day at least six days a week, with the exception of holidays, vacations, and periods of redecorating, and shall be where the principal business is conducted, with pouring being only incidental thereto.

Note: Only establishments with food sales can apply for a pouring distilled spirits (Liquor) license.

ARTICLE II. LICENSE

Sec. 15-64 Eligibility for pouring license.

Only establishments with food sales can apply for a pouring distilled spirits (liquor) license. Businesses maintaining a fixed location for the sale and service of food and beverages to members of the general public in a dining room or premises with space to seat not less than 60 persons and serving such food and beverages from a sanitary kitchen within the premises. Such businesses shall serve food and beverage not less than six days a week. And derives at least 60 percent of its total gross food sales from the sale of prepared meals or food.

Sec. 15-96. Location Restriction.

(a) It is unlawful for any person to sell alcohol within 300 feet of any Church, school building, school ground, college campus or any educational building. It is unlawful for any person to sell alcohol within 300 feet of any alcoholic treatment center owned and operated by the state or any county or municipal government therein. The distance shall be measured by the most direct route of travel ground.

SO ORDAINED, THIS 7TH DAY OF MARCH, 2011.

The foregoing ordinance received a first reading on February 7, 2011, and a second reading on March 7, 2011. Upon section reading, a motion for Passage of the Ordinance was made by Councilmember Celeste Martin, second by Councilmember Wayne Graves and upon the question the vote is 4 ayes and 0 nays, and the Ordinance is adopted.
