PRESENTATION OF A WATER PROBLEM - Celeste advised that up behind Krystal and Captain D's there is a problem with standing water. Prior to today, I talked with Everett. He came out to the site and met with me and Jerry Herndon. I have previously asked Everett what it would take to fix the water problem. He discussed inserting some under ground tiles and putting a roadbed there to continue the circle since that is old city cemetery and I thought that would be a good thing to recommend to do. I still think it is, but in talking in work session it seems there is some uncertainty; as to who owns what and who's responsibility it is. It seems there is a trust for a perpetual care cemetery that is operating off the interest. Which is not enough to maintain it. It sounds as if there is a lot of unknowns about who is in charge of what and who owns each piece of property. I still desire that the work be done. I am hoping that we can meet together with Mr. Herndon and see who owns what and see where the funds can be allocated from so the job can be done.

Mayor Penland recommended Ms. Martin get a copy of the trust and see how that works and we may need to talk to Mr. Herndon and then get back together in a work session.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Wayne advised that he had reviewed the budget and all departments are within budget and we have collected 96% of the 2012 taxes.

INFRASTRUCTURE: Gary advised that the street department reports are available. It has been a very busy month. 31 loads trash and 58 loads brush. With the rain we are having flooding in the Green flats and Treadwell Road area. Lots of mosquitos - and we are spraying.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL & TECHNOLOGY: There is an upcoming meeting in June to hear a boat and rv storage request at the Mountain View Flea Market.

Several complaints are being investigated concerning overgrown vegetation. There is a concern up at the Bealls and Freds location as well as other private owners.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Fred advised that the police report was available. Chief Martin advised there were 33 drug cases this month. A K-9 report is also available.

Chief Baxter has his reports available. The new fire truck is out back for everyone to view. Mr. Baxter advised he had a busy month and the truck should be in service soon. Jason Castoe, Jeremy Baird and Mike Baxter were invited to Chattanooga Fire Department for a couple of training days. We were also invited to Calhou to display the new truck at the North Georgia Fire Chiefs Association meeting.

Mr. Baxter advised tht he will be attending a training session in July on ISO changes and guidelines.

Mayor Penland advised there was not anything for executive session and the meeting was adjourned at 6:20 p.m.
