**CITY OF CHATSWORTH
COUNCIL MEETING
NOVEMBER 3, 2014**

The Chatsworth City Council met in regular session on Monday, November 3, 2014 at 6 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall with Mayor Penland presiding.

PRESENT: Mayor Dan Penland, Aldermen: Brad Rowe, Celeste Martin, Gary Brock and Fred Welch. City Attorney Lee Daniel. City Clerk Wilma Nolan.

MINUTES/AGENDA: Mayor Penland presented the minutes of the last meeting and the November agenda requesting approval as presented.

Celeste, "I make a motion we accept them." Brad seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

OLD BUSINESS

Presentation of an ordinance to increase the freeport exemption. (Tabled last month.)

Mayor Penland stated he would like to make a recommendation to table that again as we are now reviewing the budget. We need to see the number there before we take any action on increasing the freeport exemption.

Celeste, "I make a motion we table it." Fred seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

NEW BUSINESS

Request the approval of a malt beverage license for Estefana Nolasco, Taqueria Oaxaquena II, Inc. dba Taqueria Oaxaquena 4 Bar & Grill, 1422 Green Road.

Request the approval of a liquor license for Rstafana Nolasco, Taqueria Oaxaquena II, Inc. dba Taqueria Oaxaquena 4 Bar & Grill, 1422 Green Road.

Mayor Penland inquired of the Chief of Police if everything was in order.

The Chief advised that everything was.

Fred, "I make a motion we accept these and issue the licenses." Celeste seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Presentation of two ordinances for first reading:

1. Ordinance for Post- Development Stormwater Management and New Development and Redevelopment.
2. Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance.

Mayor Penland expressed these ordinances pertained to the MS-4 Permit - Stormwater Management Plan.

Dolley Flood advised that these are model ordinances that must be put in place for us to apply for our EPD permits.

Discussion followed concerning the implementation of the plan and the processing involved in implementation.

Gary, "I make a motion we accept this as the first reading." Fred seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Request to close City Hall, November 27-28, 2014 for Thanksgiving Holiday - (Friday would be a vacation day.)

Fred, "I so move." Celeste seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Mr. Rowe advised that he had reviewed the budget and things appear to be as we would expect. All the budgets are in and we are currently reviewing those and we hope to be able to bring that to the council next month.

INFRASTRUCTURE: We have our report from Everett, we have had another busy month. It is fixing to get busier due to leaf time.

They have also continued to service the Murray Medical Center ambulances.

Steve Smith of the Water Works advised they had gotten approval last week for the solar project. We hope to get started after the first of the year and have it in place for the spring.

Mr. Smith also advised that the MS-4 would be adding a lot of work for Everett since it includes the storm drainage.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL & TECHNOLOGY:

PUBLIC SAFETY: Fred advised that reports are available. Chief Baxter advised that he had a busy month with Fire Safety Month and the 20th FLAMES course.

Chief Etheridge advised they had responded to 1428 calls. Sgt Kelly Parker completed the alert training class at Texas State University. This is the training that is the response standard for responding to an active shooter. He is returning to train all the other officers for actual certification.

On October 22, 2014, we and other local agencies issued several warrants to convenience stores for paying out cash on gambling machines.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Mayor Penland advised there was nothing for executive session.

Presentation of a Memorandum of Agreement between the City of Chatsworth Water Works Commission and the City of Chatsworth - The Agreement reads as follows:

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH WATER WORKS COMMISSION

AND

CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA

Purpose of MOA

The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is to document the agreed upon partnership of the City of Chatsworth Water Works Commission (CWWC) and the City of Chatsworth, Georgia to implement and enforce the Storm Water Management Plan (SWMP) for the city limits of the City of Chatsworth as required by the Georgia Department Natural Resources Environmental Protection Division (EPD) in accordance with Permit Number GAG610000.

Duration

The MOA shall commence upon the signing of this document and shall terminate on the expiration date of the SWMP on December 31, 2017.

Early Termination

The MOA may be terminated by either party with a 30 days written notice informing the other party of their intention to terminate the agreement.

Amendments

The MOA may be amended at the agreement of both parties.

Scope

The scope of work agreed upon by Chatsworth Water Works Commission and the City of Chatsworth are as follows:

- A. CWWC will coordinate with City of Chatsworth personnel and Consultants hired by the city to ensure the SWMP is being implemented and followed in accordance with EPD guidelines and regulations.
- B. CWWC will serve as a liaison between the City of Chatsworth and the EPD including all correspondence and submittals.
- C. CWWC will perform engineering review of all plans with land disturbance activities for any municipal, residential and commercial development and redevelopment within the city limits of the City of Chatsworth.
- D. CWWC will review and submit all documents required under the WWMP to EPD to ensure all data and information the plan requires to be submitted is included and correct.
- E. CWWC will assist with the distribution of educational material by making brochures available to the general public and providing the material to all new customers performing any land disturbing activities when they sign up for water and sewer service with CWWC.

F. CWWC will provide support for mapping, sampling and testing functions as required in the SWMP.

Compensation

CWWC reserves the right to recoup all financial assistance incurred by CWWC as a result of meeting the work detailed in the MOA including but not limited to salaries, equipment, benefits, testing and any direct purchases that may be required. CWWC will acquire approval from the City of Chatsworth prior to purchasing any equipment or supplies as part of this MOA. The compensation shall be for the actual cost incurred with no additional mark ups. A detailed invoice for the goods and services will be submitted to the City of Chatsworth by December 1st each year if CWWC is requesting compensation for that calendar year.
