

COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 4, 2012

The Chatsworth City Council met in regular session on Monday, June 4, 2012 at 6:00 p.m. in the council chambers of City Hall with Mayor Dan Penland presiding.

PRESENT: Mayor Dan Penland, Aldermen: Wayne Graves, Celeste Martin, Gary Brock and Fred Welch. City Attorney Steve Williams and City Clerk Wilma Nolan.

Mayor Penland called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. presenting the agenda and minutes for approval. Mayor Penland entertained a motion to approve these.

Gary, "I will make that motion that we accept them." Celeste seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

NEW BUSINESS

LARRY SWANSON WISHES TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL REGARDING SIGNAGE AND SMS INC. - Mayor Penland advised that Mr. Swanson was not going to be able to be here tonight for this matter.

JOHN CHRISTIAN WISHES TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL - Mr. Christian presented information packets to the council for review. Mr. Christian advised that he was with Apple Mountain Playhouse and currently has a playhouse in Ellijay and an art center. I have had art centers for the last twenty five years in the Atlanta, Cobb county area. I came here to potentially open an arts center and it looks like we are in the progress of doing that. This is a festival, that I have been working on for about a year and a half to two years. It has been advertised on the internet for about a year. The plan possibly is that we are going to open the center here that this would be a great way to promote the Murray Arts Council that we are trying to put together. Ms. Rowe is helping us with this. The festival is basically an art integration festival which is one of a kind around the state of Georgia. What it does is promote art in all subjects. There will be 12 different workshops, each workshop also potentially could get a merit badge for girl scouts and boy scouts. I have been in contact with the state wide girl scouts including the girl scouts in the Chattanooga area. They are in dialogue with me right now. It think that we could potentially move it to the city park across the street. It could be much better for us and there are more kids this side of the mountain than that side of the mountain. The park could be a good fit for us. One of the criteria is having a place for 500-1000 girl scouts to spend the night. I have toured Cohutta Springs. There is no place in Gilmer where they want kids to spend the night. Cohutta Springs is the only one who can probably accomodate 2000-3000 kids. A lady from the scouts is going to tour the facility there and the facility here. I think this will be a great jump start for our new arts center.

This will be a two day event, September 22-23, 2012. Once we agree to something we will redo the literature and change the dates, city location. It was originally geared to bring 5000 kids. I cannot promise 5000 kids. It takes a lot of support to put this together. It is the 100th anniversary of girl scouts, one of the things they are big on is doing group projects. I was looking for a group project that could be art related and could encompass everyone. So we decided to go with the world's largest kite. That bombed out. So we went with the world's largest painting. It is going to be a picture of a girl scout on kite flying with her 100th anniversary emblem. The deal is every troupe makes a 12x15 piece of canvas, grommets around, zip tie it together.

Dinah advised that the Chamber was willing to lend their expertise to help John with this venture.

John advised that he had to build the organization, get the support together and work our way up to a playhouse. First, we are just trying to get the festival approved by the city for us to do it here.

Mayor Penland inquired if it was non-profit? He was advised that it was a 501C3 organization.

It will be called Kids Art Expo and Games. Here we will be Murray Playhouse and Studios.

Celeste, "I make a motion we approve this." Wayne seconded and the motion passed by a unanimous vote.

SCHEDULE THE JULY COUNCIL MEETING - After discussion, it was decided to go ahead with the regular time of July 2, 2012 at 6:00 p.m.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Wayne advised that he had reviewed the budget for May and all departments are within budget for the whole year. They are doing an excellent job of staying within the budget. Hopefully nothing unexpected will happen. Taxes are still at 98%.

INFRASTRUCTURE: Gary advised that the monthly report was before you for the street department's monthly activities.

Steve Smith advised that water sources are good with multiple sources and good supplies.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL & TECHNOLOGY: Celeste advised that Dolley was working on clean-up work. The Sane house has been demolished.

PUBLIC SAFETY: John Parker was present in the absence of Mike Baxter. John presented the reports for the month and directed their attention to the fire hydrant report. About one third of them have been cleaned and inspected and they hope to have this complete in July.

Terry Martin presented the monthly reports. He had two officers in Mississippi on drug training classes. Prescription drugs are still a big problem. A new radar gun has been purchased with confiscated drug funds. There were three burglaries and they have already been solved. There were three shootings this past weekend.

There were 87 speed control citations written. There were 37 accidents last month and 20 this month so maybe this will help slow the trend down. More signage has been requested on the other side of Duvall going west.

There was not any other business to come before the council. Mayor Penland called for a motion to adjourn.

Gary, "I make that motion." Fred seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.
