COUNCIL MEETING
MARCH 3, 2014**

The Chatsworth City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 3, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the council chambers of city hall with Mayor Dan Penland presiding.

PRESENT: Mayor Dan Penland, Aldermen: Brad Rowe, Celeste Martin, Gary Brock and Fred Welch.
City Attorney: Steve Williams and City Clerk Wilma Nolan.

Mayor Penland called the meeting to order and presented the agenda. The first order of business being the approval of the minutes of last meeting and the agenda for this meeting.

Celest advised that the agenda needed to be amended to add this GSI bill.

Gary, "I make a motion we approve the minutes and amend the agenda to add the GSI contract."

Fred, "I second with that amendment." The motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

NEW BUSINESS

Presentation of an ordinance of annexation for second reading for Sandra Joy Howard, 221 Rollie Avenue, .38 acre as R-1 (Low Density Residential) The ordinance reads as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH

ANNEXING the following property in the corporate limits of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia consisting of .38 acres in Land Lot No. 205 in the 9th District, Parcel 0048C-009 and being known as portion of 221 Rollie Avenue.

WHEREAS, application has been filed by Sandra Joy Howard for annexing property in the corporate limits of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, following proper notice, a public hearing was held before this body; and

WHEREAS, all conditions of home rule annexation as set forth by the State Legislature have been met; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council do hereby find as a fact that said petition meets the requirements of O.C.G.A. Section 36-36-21 as amended, now and therefore,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA, THAT;

Section 1: Best Interest Determination

Prior to annexing the property described herein, the Chatsworth City Council finds, as a matter of fact, that the annexation of the property described herein into the municipal corporation of the area proposed in the Application for Annexation would be in the best interest of the residents and property owners of the area proposed for annexation and of the citizens of the municipal corporation.

Section 2: The following property to wit

All that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the Ninth (9th) District and Third (3rd) Section of Murray County, Georgia, designated as "Tract E", according to a part of survey prepared by William J. Boulding, Georgia Registered Land Surveyor No. 2566, dated April 26, 1995, recorded May 9, 1995, in the office of the clerk of the Superior Court of Murray County, Georgia, in Plat Book No. 28, page 187, and said plat and the description set out therein are by reference incorporated herein for a more particular description of land.

Subject to Protective Covenants dated May 19, 1995, recorded in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Murray County, Georgia.

Said Property is to be Zoned R-1 (Low Density Residential)
Total population 1
Said Tract contains .38 acre

Section 3: Plans for extension of services to the area proposed to be annexed

The City of Chatsworth, pursuant to O.C.G.A. Section 36-36-35, has made plans for extension of the services to the area proposed to be annexed and such plans are on file at the Chatsworth City Hall. Further, said plans were made available to the public hearing held in conjunction with this proposed annexation.

Section 4: The above described property is hereby annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia and shall have an effective date of March 3, 2014 for ad valorem tax purposes under Georgia Law.

Section 5: The above described property is hereby placed within the corporate limits of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia.

Section 6: It is hereby declared to be the intention of this ordinance that sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of this ordinance.

Section 7: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 8: This ordinance shall become effective upon the signature of the Mayor, subject to Georgia Laws 1983, page 4119.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Alderman Rowe advised that he had reviewed the expenditure report. Expenditures seem to be in order against the budget. The revenue stream seems to be in order.

Alderman Rowe asked that it be noted he completed the GMA's Newly Elected Officials Training this past weekend. Therefore, I am officially trained.

INFRASTRUCTURE: Everett has had a cold and wet January to deal with. Alderman Brock stated they had done a good job keeping the streets and everything cleaned. They always do a good job.

Everett advised they would have a problem in the months to come with the streets as the ground freezes and thaws there will be holes in the streets.

Everett advised he had calculated the costs for the emergency services. However, we did not qualify. Mr. Bain advised that we would have had to have expense of \$130,000, which we did not have.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AND TECHNOLOGY: We have a copy of the city marshal report. It looks like he has responded to complaints and calls. Looks like the usual.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Alderman Welch advised that the fire department was not with us tonight.

The police department report is here, the K-9 reports and incident reports.

Chief Etheridge advised that on February 6, 2014, Officer Ingle and the K-9 unit assisted the Murray County Sheriff's department with a random drug search at North Murray High School.

On February 27, 2014, we had two officers, Officer Harrison and Fraser, attend a training session at Dalton PD. Officer Harrison won an alco-sensor (Valued at \$550) and donated it to the police department.

Jason Miller was hired and began work with the department this past Friday. He had been a deputy with the sheriff's department and also assisted with investigations there for a short time.

To support them in the operation of the hospital, the indigent care expenses and continued ambulance service for the hospital. As you all know we have been in meetings with the hospital authority. In their executive sessions, we have all signed confidentiality agreements with certain information we cannot reveal at this point and time. At this point, we will open it up for discussion but guard what you say based on that confidentiality agreement.

Ms. Martin stated that collectively we all view the hospital as a viable economic engine in our community and it is something we have had the benefit of having for a number of years and we see the advantage of it continuing.



It helps with economic development plus the fact that if it ended up that we did not have a hospital and someone has a heart attack, stroke or bad accident in the county and an ambulance service has to come from another county and takes an excessive amount of time then we do not know the outcome of what can happen there.

Gary, "I just make a motion that we give the hospital some assistance, the amount to be determined when we have final information."

Brad Rowe seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0. Celeste stated that we have everyone's best interest in mind. First and foremost, we want to be good stewards of the the taxpayer's money but we also want to provide life saving service and that is critical.
