COUNCIL MEETING
DECEMBER 3, 2018

The Chatsworth City Council met in regular session on Monday, December 3, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the council chambers of city hall with Mayor Tyson Haynes presiding.

PRESENT: Mayor Tyson Haynes, Aldermen: Rhett Griffin, K. W. Gong, Jeff Cloer and Fred Welch. City Attorney Steve Williams and City Clerk Wilma Nolan.

Mayor Haynes called the meeting to order and asked that a third item be added to the agenda - An Appointment to the Downtown Development Authority - under new business. Also, I would like the council to review the minutes and agenda as amended.

Fred, "I make a motion we accept the minutes and the agenda with the amendment." Rhett seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

NEW BUSINESS

Presentation of the second reading of an amendment to the City Ordinance and special events permits. The Ordinance reads as follows:

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA, captioned "Alcoholic Beverages" by repealing existing Article I in General; Sec. 15-2 Purpose of Chapter Sec. 15-7 Possession of unsealed containers and Sec. 15-8 Possession in Public Places, in its entirety and replacing therewith a re-stated Article 1 Sec. 15-1, Sec. 15-7; Sec. 15-8 Still to be entitled "Alcoholic Beverages" which shall constitute a comprehensive Alcoholic Beverage Ordinance for the City of Chatsworth; and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, and by the authority of the same, **IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:**

1. Repeal existing Article I Sec. 15-8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, in its entirety replacing therewith a re-stated Article I in General; Sec. 15-8 Possession in Public Places; Sec. 15-9 Responsibility to examine Proper Identification; Exception of Prohibitions; Sec. 15-67 Annual Fees; Sec. 15-106 Temporary Permits for non profit Civic Organizations, still to be entitled "Alcoholic Beverages"

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature of the Mayor.

Article I. In General

Sec. 15-8 Possession in Public Places

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and (section 15-9), it shall be unlawful for any person to drink, consume, transport, carry alcoholic beverage (except in the original package and with the seal unbroken), on any public street, sidewalk, or in any city park, city maintained recreation facility, public parking lot or comipublic parking lot located within the city limits. The term "semi public parking lot" shall include any area wherein motor vehicles are parked by the public in conjunction with any business,

enterprise, commercial establishment, office building or apartment building.

(b) The following activities shall not be a violation of this section.

1. Beer and/or wine and/or distilled spirits by the drink within a special outdoor area as provided in section 15-9, or has city approved and been issued a temporary permit good for a 3 day event.
 1. Beer and/or wine and/or distilled spirits by the drink within a special areas as provided in section 15-9, and/or has been issued a Special Event Permit by the city.
 2. One drink on-street limit within a Special Event Area. Any establishment within the Special Event Permit area licensed to dispense an alcoholic beverage by the drink for consumption on the premises is authorized to dispense an alcoholic beverage in paper or plastic cup and with proper wristband conforming to specifications promulgated by the City Police Department from time to time for removal from the premises, and no person shall remove at one time more than one such alcoholic beverage from licensed premises.
 - 3.. Size limited to 16 ounces. No container in which an alcoholic beverage is dispensed and removed from the licensed premises shall exceed 16 fluid ounces in size. No person shall hold in possession on the streets and sidewalks, in parks and squares, or in other public places where a special Event Permit has been issued any open alcoholic beverage container in which exceeds 16 fluid ounces in size.
 - 4.. Drinking from can, bottle, or glass prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to drink or attempt to drink and alcoholic beverage from a can, bottle, or glass or to possess in an open can, bottle, or glass any alcoholic beverage on the streets, sidewalks, right-of-way any parking lots, whether public or private.
 5. Consumption of an alcoholic beverage in a parked or moving vehicle within the area where a Special Event Permit has been issued is prohibited.

Sec. 15-9 Responsibility to examine proper identification; exception to prohibitions

It shall be the responsibility of the licensee and/or the permittee to examine the proper identification of each patron to ascertain that such patron is 21 years of age or older. The prohibitions of section 15-11 of the Code shall not apply with respect to the sale of alcoholic beverages by a person when such person has been furnished with identification showing the alcohol beverages is to be sold to a person who is 21 years of age or older.

Sec. 15-67 Annual fees for Special Event Permit

(A) Each person Selling distilled spirits in the city shall pay an annual license fee as follows

1. Wholesaler \$100.00
2. Pouring \$1500.00
3. Private club, pouring only \$1500.00
4. Special Event Permit \$50.00
5. Local Caterer or Concessionaire \$100.00/event

(B) Each person selling malt beverages in the City shall pay an annual license fee as follows:

1. Wholesaler \$100.00
2. Retailer, package only \$500.00
3. Pouring \$500.00
4. Private club, pouring only \$500.00
5. Special Event Permit \$50.00
6. Local caterer or concessionaire \$50.00/event

(C) Each person selling wine in the city shall pay an annual license fee as follows:

1. Wholesaler \$100.00
2. Retailer, package only \$500.00
3. Pouring \$500.00
4. Private Club, pouring only \$500.00
5. Special Event Permit \$50.00
6. Local caterer or concessionaire \$50.00/event

State law reference: Maximum amount of license fees for sale of distilled spirits, O.C.G.A. § 3-4-50; municipal governing authority to fix malt beverage license fee, O.C.G.A § 3-5-42

Sec. 15-106 Special Event Permit for nonprofit civic organizations.

- (a) For the purpose of this section, a "nonprofit" civic organization is defined as an organization which is an exempt organization under section 501 (c) or (d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, whose membership includes city residents or property owners.
- (b) Upon filing of an application, payment of the required fee and notifications to the police chief on the required form by a nonprofit civic organization, the city clerk may issue a permit authorizing the organization to serve alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises or for off-premises consumption, or both for a period not to exceed three days, subject to any law regulation the time for serving such beverages. No more that six permits may be issued to a qualified organization in any one calendar year pursuant to this section. Permits issued pursuant to this section shall be valid only for the location, times and dates specified in the permit. No permit may be issued unless the sale of such alcohol beverage is lawful in the place for which the permit is issued.
