COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE: Alderman Graves advised that we were within budget with the taxes 98% collected. We are proceeding with legal action upon owners with three years delinquent taxes.

INFRASTRUCTURE: The street department collected 65 loads of brush and 39 loads of trash. Fifteen loads of residential sanitation and 8 loads of commercial sanitation.

Presentation of a proposal for the Chatsworth Housing Authority for parking on Ross Avenue and Sixth Avenue. The proposal reads as follows:

ROSS AVENUE AND SIXTH AVENUE PARKING PROPOSAL **\$65269.00**

Presentation of an Off System Safety Grant contract for acceptance. Mayor Haynes advised this contract was for 49 streets, providing, striping, stop bars, signage, etc.

Upon review the Mayor called for a motion to accept the proposal and the contract and authorize the Mayor to execute these on behalf of the city.

Gary, "I make a motion we accept the contracts and authorize the Mayor to execute the contracts." Fred seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Water Commission General Manager Martin was present to make the public aware of the new irrigation rates which are effective on June 1, 2011. The periods of June thru September sewer will be based on the winter average of October thru March. This will be automatic for the single family residential customers, all others must sign.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL & TECHNOLOGY: Presentation of a Nuisance Abatement Ordinance for first reading - Following reading, Gary, "I make a motion we adopt this as the first reading." Wayne seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Presentation of a cost estimate for Supplement 1 of the Code of Ordinances - Alderwoman Martin advised this information was for reference and no action was needed at this time.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Chief Baxter advised that they had assisted with mutual aid at Ringgold. He had also assisted with the building of a shelter at a burn camp. Lastly, he had provided haz-mat training for the sheriff's department.

Chief Martin was in training and was not present. The property owner was to be contacted in regard to the clean-up efforts at Murray Lodge.

GBI is providing training on the various methods used in the production of illegal drugs.

Attorney Williams was advised to provide direction on the legal action necessary to cover clean-up of drug labs.

Marshal Smith advised he had been dealing with signs and one animal matter.

Mayor Haynes advised that a National Day of Prayer would be observed at the City Park on May 5, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.

Also, on May 14, 2011 the Creme Hut would be having a cruise-in.

Mayor Haynes also expressed his continued appreciation to Everett Jones and the street department on the excellent work they do.

Mayor Haynes adjourned the meeting at 5:40 p.m.
