Presentation of an ordinance of annexation for the first reading for Sandra Joy Howard, 221 Rollie Avenue, .38 acres as R-1 (Low Density Residential).

The Petition of Sandra Joy Howard to annex her property into the City as Low Density Residential (R-1). The property under consideration, approximately 0.38 acre of land lies in a residential neighborhood in the County, and is zoned Suburban Residential (SR). The eastern side of the lot is contiguous to the City.

After hearing the petition, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend to the Mayor and City Council that the petitioner's request to annex her property into the City as Low Density Residential (R-1) be granted.

The police reports, K-9 reports and investigator reports are all available. With us tonight we have Lt. Scott Bickford and our police committee appointee as new chief Mr. Josh Etheridge. Any questions of either of these two gentlemen or the reports. There were none.
